

## Dogs on beaches

**During the summer season (November 1 - March 31) there are seven dog beaches in Port Phillip where dogs can play off-leash. These are the only beaches where dogs can venture during the summer.**

Five of these have unrestricted access for dogs:

- > St Kilda - between Brooks Jetty and the northern end of the car park towards St Kilda Marina (area ref 16)
- > West St Kilda - from St Kilda Pier along Pier Road for 400 metres towards Middle Park Beach (area ref 15)
- > Middle Park - between Langridge Street and 140 metres past Fraser Street toward St Kilda (area ref 22)
- > Port Melbourne - Sandridge Beach between the rock groyne opposite Barak Road and the rock groyne opposite Cumberland Road (area ref 10)
- > Port Melbourne - between Lagoon Pier and south west to Dow Street (area ref 11)

Two are early morning beaches only:

- > Elwood - between the rock groyne south of Point Ormond and the beach access ramp 35 metres south east of Normandy Road, **5.30am-9.30am only** (area ref 19).
- > Middle Park - between Kerferd Road pier and Langridge Street, **5.30am-9.30am only** (area ref 23).

The off-peak season (April 1 - October 31) opens up all Port Phillip beaches to dogs off-leash (except two environmentally sensitive areas where dogs are not allowed at any time of the year). Remember, dogs need to be under effective voice control and you still need to carry a leash. And don't forget to take a couple of bags or devices so you can pick up any droppings.

## No go for dogs

Some environmentally sensitive areas of Port Phillip are closed to dogs completely. Please keep your dog away from these conservation zones:

- > Sandridge Beach, Port Melbourne (including all of the beach and the Perce White Reserve).

To allow access to the Webb Dock walkway, dogs on leashes are permitted on the sealed road reserve, including the car park and footpath, from Todd Road to the walkway.

- > West Beach, St Kilda (from a point 400m north of the St Kilda Pier to a point in line with the end of the pavilion on the beach, past Cowderoy Street).

Dogs are also not permitted within five (5) metres of playgrounds, public barbeques or exercise equipment areas.

## Off-leash areas

**Exercising your dog is a great way to enjoy the local environment and keep both you and your pet fit and healthy. The City of Port Phillip understands that dog owners need space to let their dogs run and play without a leash.**

However it is important to be a responsible pet owner. All dogs should be kept on a leash when outside your property, except for the off-leash areas designated by the City of Port Phillip. When visiting an off-leash area, dog owners still need to carry a leash at all times and ensure the dog remains in sight, is under effective voice control and does not threaten other people or animals.

Dog owners should also be aware of restrictions that may apply at various times of the year on our local beaches.

Dog owners face an on the spot fine for walking dogs on prohibited beaches, for dogs wandering at large, for not having dogs on leashes when they should be or for failing to pick up after their dog.

## Bin it or swim in it

Please remember to carry a few bags or devices when walking your dog and pick up any droppings to help keep our bay and beaches clean.
